

US States laws on hemp consumables

Southeast States

Georgia

- THC Limits: Hemp products must contain no more than 0.3% Delta-9 THC on a dry weight basis.
- Maximum Serving Size: 10mg of delta-9 THC
- Maximum Package Size: 150mg of delta-9 THC

Alabama³

- THC Limits: Hemp products must contain no more than 0.3% Delta-9 THC on a dry weight basis.
- Maximum Serving Size: There are no explicit maximum serving size limits for hemp consumables in Alabama, as long as the product adheres to the 0.3% THC limit.
- Maximum Package Size: Similarly, Alabama does not specify a maximum package size for hemp consumables, provided the overall THC content remains compliant with the 0.3% limit

Florida¹

- THC Limits: Hemp products must contain no more than 0.3% Delta-9 THC on a dry weight basis.
- Maximum Serving Size: Florida does not specify a maximum serving size directly, but products must adhere to the THC limit.
- Maximum Package Size: There are no explicit limits on package size mentioned, but each product must meet packaging requirements, including labeling and a Certificate of Analysis showing compliance with THC limits

Louisiana²

- Maximum serving size: 8 mg of total THC per serving.
- Maximum package size: No more than 0.3% Delta-9 THC by weight, with a total THC concentration limit of 1%.

- Floral hemp material: Must not exceed 1% total THC on a dry weight basis

Kentucky⁵

- Maximum Serving Size: Ingestible cannabinoid products must contain no more than 2.5 mg of THC per serving.
- Maximum Package Size: Each product must list the total cannabinoids per package, but no specific package size limit is outlined.
- THC Limits: Products cannot exceed 0.3% Delta-9 THC on a dry weight basis

South Carolina⁶

- THC Limits: Products must contain no more than 0.3% Delta-9 THC on a dry weight basis.
- Maximum Serving Size: The law does not specify a maximum serving size for hemp-derived products.
- Maximum Package Size: There are no explicit limits on package size, but all products must comply with labeling and THC content regulations

Tennessee⁴

- Maximum Serving Size: Ingestible HDC products cannot contain more than 25 mg of any single HDC or combination of HDCs per serving.
- Maximum Package Size: The total amount of HDCs in the entire package must be clearly labeled, but no specific package size limit is set as long as it meets the THC and cannabinoid concentration requirements.
- THC Limits: Products must contain no more than 0.3% Delta-9 THC on a dry weight basis

States where marijuana is legal recreationally

Colorado⁷

- Maximum serving size for recreational marijuana edibles: 10 mg of THC.

- Maximum package size: 100 mg of THC per package

California⁷

- Maximum serving size: 10 mg of THC per serving.
- Maximum package size: 100 mg of THC per package for edibles

Oregon⁷

- Maximum serving size: 5 mg of THC per serving for hemp edibles.
- Maximum package size: 50 mg per package for edibles

Washington⁷

- Maximum serving size: 10 mg of THC per serving.
- Maximum package size: 100 mg of THC per package
